What You Will Learn...

The following is a short description of the LHC program sessions as currently structured. Please note that the schedule and syllabus are flexible and subject to change. Also, day sessions are **All-day** classes. **8AM to 5PM**

Session I: Team Building Retreat September 12-13, 2024 (Mandatory Session)

September 12-13, 2024 (Mandatory Session) The Retreat is held at Frankfort KY at the Kentucky

Chamber and is a team building exercise where class members will learn more about their fellow classmates. You will also hear from engaging speakers who will discuss increasing human performance and different leadership styles. Through class team building exercises you will also become acquainted with presentation techniques as you each participate in discussions on leadership and some top issues facing Hardin County in the upcoming years.

Session II: History of Hardin County

October 17, 2024

This session will focus on the History of the entire county. Teams will be broken into groups to research and present on what they learned about their assigned time period. Entertaining presenters will also join us to share some interesting and humorous stories about our local community.

Session III: Education

November 21, 2024

This class will examine the local educational system. It will include tours to some of the local educational facilities and evaluate the regional educational environment, how Hardin County ranks and ways in which we might improve.

Session IV: Fort Knox Day

January 16, 2025

This session consists of a behind-the-scenes tour of our neighbor Fort Knox. Tours of some of the latest developments are being planned.

Session V: Health and Human Services

February 20, 2025

This session focuses on the services available in our community to help people. Presentations by State, County and community personnel, who deliver these services, will be augmented by visits to various community sites.

Session VI: Leadership in Hardin County March 20, 2025

This session reviews the top 3 issues facing Hardin County. The class will be broken into groups and will present different leadership projects. We will also hear from our Local Government Officials about what leadership traits they use as they govern our communities.

Session VII: Law & Justice April 17, 2025

The class will travel to the Hardin County Hall of Justice and meet with the Circuit, District and Supreme Court Justices, as well as the government attorneys who practice in those courts. A trip to the county jail completes the session.

Session VIII: Economic Development

May 15, 2025

This session acquaints the class with the fundamentals of economic development. Through discussions, exercises and site visits the class will examine the needs and capabilities of our community.

Session IX: Graduation June 2025

Graduation marks the conclusion of Leadership Hardin County for the year. Students will be recognized for fulfilling their commitment to the program and students will have the opportunity to say what they enjoyed most from the program.

Graduation will be open to Leadership Alumni, community leaders, sponsors, family and friends of the graduate. Special Awards will also be presented.
